## Millington wood

ERYC along with Natural England and The Forestry Commission have laid out plans to remove dangerous trees with Ash dieback from Millington Wood. Areas will be cleared, rested and planted with new species.

Other areas will be thinned out, as the wood contains many rare plants which are being shaded out by the large trees and not thriving. Diseased trees not causing a danger will be left to decay naturally.

The wood will only be closed on days that felling takes place.
