REFERENDA PRINCIPLES

CALL FOR EVIDENCE

ERNLLCA has been advised that the Government is, once again, to revisit the issue of whether or not parish and town councils should be subjected to referenda principles where any increase in the precept is in excess of 2%.

We contributed to a very successful campaign last year to discourage Government from going down this route. The Government has now published figures which show that the average Band D council tax for 2017/2018 has increased by 6.3% - for further information see

Whilst 6.3% may seem a large increase, its monetary value if £3.63 per year!

In order to, yet again, persuade Government that applying referenda principles is unnecessary, we have to gather evidence to show that increases over 2% are needed to support local communities. To that end we have devised a very short questionnaire which I urge your council to complete.

Please complete and return this form by Thursday 19 May 2017, even if your council did not increase its precept above 5%.

Without hard evidence, we will not be able to persuade Government to allow local people to make local decisions about local issues.
